Students are satisfied with the internal evaluation done at the institute level


Students are made aware of course outcomes, program outcomes, and program-specific outcomes.

The teaching, learning, and mentoring processes at the institute are very good.


Students wished to have more usage of the student centric method, which can enhance their learning.

Students expect more efforts to be made to enhance employability skills, soft skills


Q1: Percentage of Syllabus coverage in the Class




Q2: Teachers preparedness for the course delivery in the classes




Q3: Teachers Communication Skills




Q4: Teachers' Approach towards Teaching the Course




Q5: Internal Evaluation by teachers






Q7: Opportunities provided to students for internship, student exchange, field visit.


























Q19: Percentage of Teachers using ICT Tools while teaching
