Students acknowledge the transparency in assessment criteria, which are consistently defined and communicated at the beginning of each course.


While students appreciate the existing academic curriculum, they are eager to see additional initiatives aimed at enhancing their employability skills.

Students understand the specific expectations for each assessment task, ensuring fairness and consistency in the evaluation process


Students express a desire for more real-world application of theoretical concepts. Integrating practical examples and real-world projects into the curriculum can help students see the practical relevance of what they are learning.


Q1: Percentage of Syllabus coverage in the Class




Q 2: Teacher's preparedness for the course delivery in the classes




Q 3: Teachers Communication Skills




Q 4: Teachers' Approach towards Teaching the Course




Q 5: Internal Evaluation by teachers




Q 6: Performance in the assignments discussed with the students




Q 7: Opportunities provided to students for internship, student exchange, field visit.




Q 8: Effectiveness of Teaching and Mentoring Process






















Q 18: Efforts to inculcate employability skills, life skills and soft skills




Q 19: Percentage of Teachers using ICT Tools while teaching




Q 20: Overall quality of Teaching Learning process in the institution
