ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE (Session 2024-25)

ANNUAL REPORT

The Anti-Ragging Committee at SSGMCE, Shegaon, undertook sustained and concrete efforts to combat the menace of ragging and to ensure a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment for all students on campus. Throughout the academic year 2024–2025, the committee implemented a range of measures focusing on prevention, awareness, and timely intervention. These initiatives aimed to sensitize students about the harmful effects of ragging, encourage responsible behaviour, and provide robust mechanisms for addressing any reported incidents effectively.

At the beginning of the academic year, awareness programs were organized for all students. These sessions familiarized them with the college's anti-ragging policies, rules, and regulations. Through informative presentations and interactive discussions, students were made aware of the serious consequences of engaging in ragging activities, including legal penalties and disciplinary actions.

To further strengthen awareness, the committee conducted campus-wide campaigns. Posters, banners, and pamphlets were strategically displayed to disseminate information about anti-ragging policies and reporting procedures. Social media platforms were also utilized to extend the reach of these messages and reinforce the anti-ragging stance.

An Anti-Ragging Awareness Session was also held during the Student Orientation & Induction Program 2024–2025, introducing new entrants to the institute's zero-tolerance policy, relevant legal provisions, and available support mechanisms.

Anti-Ragging Day was observed on 12 August 2025, followed by Anti-Ragging Week from 12 to 18 August 2025. As part of the observance, a Poster and Slogan Competition was organized to highlight the ill effects of ragging and promote a culture of respect and inclusivity. Students participated enthusiastically, and the best entries were awarded certificates of appreciation.

To ensure vigilance, Anti-Ragging Squads were constituted and tasked with conducting surprise visits to high-traffic student areas such as the canteen, mess, and boys' and girls' hostels. The Chief Warden, wardens, and security personnel maintained strict oversight to ensure that no untoward incident occurred.

The committee met twice during the academic year to review progress and plan future strategies. Owing to the consistent and coordinated efforts of all members, no case of ragging was reported during 2024–2025, reaffirming the institute's strong commitment to maintaining a ragging-free campus.
