### MINUTES OF MEETING of ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE (Session 2025-26)

Minutes of the II<sup>nd</sup> Meeting of the Anti-Ragging Committee held on Monday, 16<sup>th</sup> March 2026 at 03:15pm (Admin Building Meeting Hall).

#### Item I:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

#### Item II: To discuss the quarrel happened amongst students outside the college and check the angle of ragging

- The committee deliberated in detail on the reported quarrel (13<sup>th</sup> March 2026, outside the campus around 07:30pm) involving certain students from first year (Prince Wajge, Yash Maliye, Abhiraj Kadam-all staying at S. V. Hostel) and second year (Om Tale, Gaurav Halde, Sumit Chavhan-all localites) that occurred outside the college premises. The matter was examined thoroughly to ascertain whether there was any direct or indirect link to ragging.

In this regard, the committee reviewed statements from the students staying at the hostel. The members carefully analysed the sequence of events and the background of the incident. Upon detailed scrutiny, it was concluded that the incident was not related to ragging in any form.

To further verify the overall campus environment, the committee conducted random interactions with students across various branches, including first-year to final-year students. During these interactions, students expressed that the campus maintains a healthy and ragging-free atmosphere. Additionally, several students submitted written statements with their signatures, affirming that no ragging practices exist on the campus.

It was also observed that the quarrel between the concerned students was personal and old one, not related to the college environment or any form of ragging activity. The committee, therefore, concluded that the matter does not fall under the purview of ragging. However, students were advised to maintain discipline and resolve personal issues amicably to uphold the decorum of the institution.

**Item III: To review cases of ragging, if any**

The committee reviewed any reported or pending cases of ragging during the current academic period. There were no cases reported.

**Item IV: Display of Anti-ragging posters and related information**

The committee emphasized the importance of **visual awareness mechanisms** in preventing ragging and promoting a safe campus environment. In this regard, **anti-ragging posters, banners, and informative materials** have been prominently displayed at strategic locations across the campus, including **academic buildings, corridors, canteen, library, administrative block, and boys' & girls' hostels**.

These displays contained **clear messages highlighting the prohibition of ragging**, its harmful psychological and social effects, and the **strict disciplinary actions** associated with such activities. Additionally, the posters included **important contact details**, such as members of the Anti-Ragging Committee, wardens, and the **UGC Anti-Ragging Helpline**, enabling students to report incidents easily and confidentially.

The content of the displayed materials was designed to be **informative, impactful, and student-friendly**, aiming to sensitize students and reinforce the institute's **zero-tolerance policy towards ragging**. Regular monitoring was carried out to ensure that the posters remained intact, visible, and updated as required.

Through these continuous efforts, the institute ensured that awareness regarding anti-ragging measures remained **visible, accessible, and effective** throughout the academic year.

**Item V: Any other point**

Additional issues related to anti-ragging measures, student discipline, awareness initiatives, or preventive strategies were discussed with the permission of the Chair. Members also suggested new measures to strengthen vigilance, improve reporting mechanisms, and enhance the effectiveness of anti-ragging initiatives across the campus.
